Start of the School Day

The majority of our schools have attendance rates that are above the average for primary schools in Devon, which is 94.7% so that is very positive indeed. Governors also take an active interest in attendance figures and the Lead Governor for attendance collates data from all ten schools and talks to us about any emerging trends or concerns before reporting to the federation board at our termly meetings.
