#### **Federation News from Mr Jolliffe**

This week we have had an Ofsted inspection at Silverton C of E school and welcomed two inspectors on Tuesday and Wednesday to the school. As you may have heard in the news, the way that inspectors report their findings to parents is due to change in the autumn, with the introduction of a 'report card' that covers more areas of the school's work and gives different grades from the system that is currently in place. It was interesting to see that some of these changes are already starting to be included in the conversations between senior leaders and the inspection team and to see how these might impact on schools that are inspected after September 2025. We will receive a draft report from the inspector early next term and then share it with you once the quality assurance process is complete, which is likely to be around the beginning of May.

#### **TERM DATES**

The spring term finishes next Friday, 4<sup>th</sup> April 2025 and the summer term starts immediately after Bank Holiday Monday on Tuesday, 22<sup>nd</sup> April. Half term starts on Friday, 22<sup>nd</sup> May and schools come back after the break on Monday, 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2025. The final staff training day of the year is on Friday, 27<sup>th</sup> June and term ends on Friday, 25<sup>th</sup> July 2025.

The **National Education Union** is currently balloting its members on pay and funding. As the workplace rep, I want to take this opportunity to share some information with you all. It's not about the pay. It's about doing the best for your children.

The most recent Government pay offer is **unfunded**. This means that money would need to come out of schools' existing budgets.

But the trouble is, schools simply can't afford any more cuts. There are no more efficiencies to be made. We are already struggling to fund the rise in National Insurance: the cost of this for our Exe Valley Schools is £96k, yet we have only received £72k in our budget to fund it.

More schools in the UK are in deficit now than at any point since at least 2010.

As a country we have the highest primary class sizes in Europe and the highest secondary class sizes on record. More than a million pupils are taught in classes of over 30.
