Federation News from Mr Jolliffe

As a large group of maintained schools, our main professional partners are Devon Education Services and the Diocese of Exeter. The relationship that we have with the diocese is particularly important to our four church schools but the vision and values that are held by the diocese are equally valid for community schools, in that they want to see both adults and children flourishing and thriving, wherever they are educated. Earlier this week, Exe Valley and Moorsway Federation senior leaders and governors met with the Diocesan Director of Education and two other senior advisers to help them understand more about our current position and plans for collaborative working with the South Hams Federation. This was a very positive meeting and enabled us to share our drive and ambition to improve the learning and well-being of children in all our schools. The local authority and diocese are represented on the Management Partnership steering group and are consulted as part of the discussion every time we re-federate.

CORNWOOD C of E SCHOOL SIAMS INSPECTION

Church schools are visited every five years by a SIAMS inspector, which gives them an opportunity to share their vision and values and answer questions about Collective Worship, RE teaching and the role of the school in the community. Cornwood was inspected at the beginning of February and received a very positive report which celebrated their strengths as a church school. David Walliams: Slime, Mr Stink, Gangstar Granny, The Midnight Gang


Jamie Smart: Bunny vs Monkey, Looshkin
